grow into something more than a business networking or representative body.

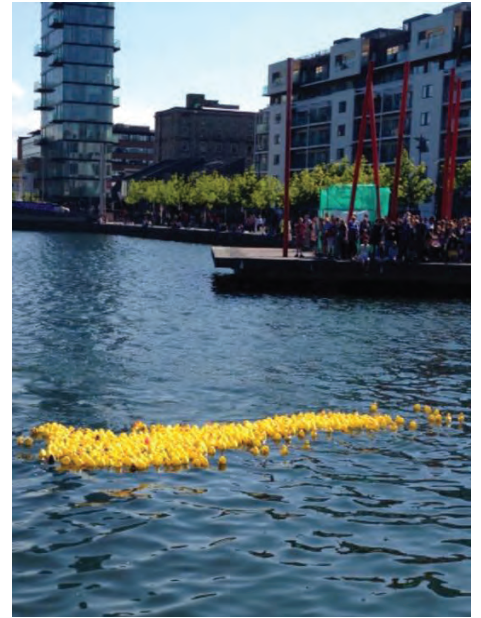
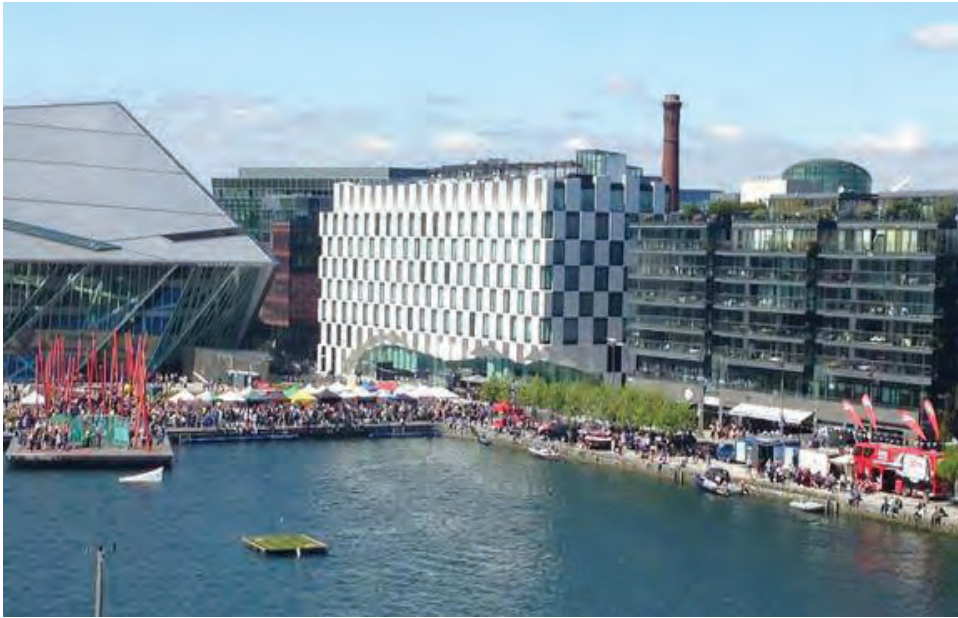
We have also become a community of engaged business people with a wider role and grander ambition.

PROMOTING THE DOCKLANDS AS A PLACE TO VISIT & ENJOY



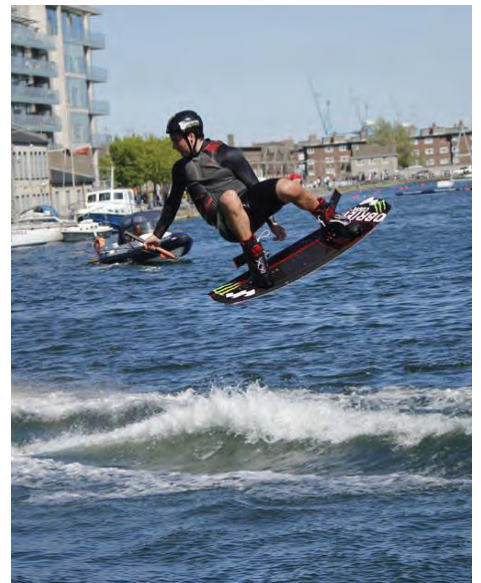
The Docklands is an untapped resource for tourism and sporting activities. The refurbished Grand Canal Basin and North Wall Quay are unmatched urban locations for water sports.

The transportation infrastructure, with Luas running along Mayor Street and DART coming in at the Grand Canal Dock, can move people efficiently into and out of the area. Seven large hotels are within walking distance.

There is a real opportunity for international events to be hosted annually in the Docklands and the Docklands Business Forum plan to make this happen.

A primary aim of the Forum is to promote the Docklands as a place to visit and enjoy. We organise two festivals to achieve this. The 3rd Waterway Ireland Docklands Summer Festival was held on the 18th & 19th of May and attracted over 80,000 visitors. Over 38,000 people attended the 1st Dublin Port River Fest on North Wall Quay.
